Located on the historic Stanton estate in Anaheim, CA, Fairmont Preparatory Academy is a WASC-accredited destination high school serving students from throughout Southern California and the world. Fairmont Prep is recognized for top academic opportunities and outcomes, highly individualized guidance and support, and the global worldview and ethos of its students and faculty.

We offer an unparalleled blend of 21 AP classes, college-level math curriculum, selective Medical and Engineering Magnet programs, and an International Baccalaureate diploma program. Within our school community, academic rigor is balanced with a vibrant campus life that includes a strong athletics program with 14 varsity sports, over 50 different clubs and organizations, student government, and award-winning fine and performing arts programs. Many of our clubs and organizations are student-founded and student-run with the help of faculty advisors.

Although our students come predominately from Southern California, our international student body reflects a robust international community with students from Bosnia, Brazil, Canada, China, Denmark, Georgia, Germany, Hong Kong, Italy, Japan, Kazakhstan, Korea, Poland, Russia, Singapore, Spain, Taiwan and Vietnam. These students add a global perspective as well as richness and depth to in-class discussions, helping us to create a community of scholars that exhibits maturity, well-roundedness, and thoughtfulness about what it means to live, learn, and work as citizens of a global community. We encourage our students to experience a multicultural and multilingual education and aim to enrich their worldview through targeted activities and opportunities such as school driven internships and international community service.

CLASS OF 2011

Fairmont Prep administered 448 AP exams in 2011 with a pass rate of 79.5%. 34% of exams resulted in a score of 5. Fairmont students have been committed International Baccalaureate scholars with 53 students completing 162 IB subject entries.

The Class of 2011 had 160 members, 30* IB diploma candidates, 24 Medical Magnet students, and 10 Engineering Magnet students. Fairmont Preparatory Academy does not rank.

MEDICAL MAGNET PROGRAM

This rigorous program provides students with a solid math and science education in preparation for medical and pre-medical studies. The Medical Magnet faculty includes doctors of chemistry and biology. Lecture series, internships, clinical and research opportunities along with a community service component provide students with unique first-hand experiences in the healthcare profession. The Class of 2011 graduated 24 Medical Magnet students, representing an increase from 17 students in 2010.

ENGINEERING MAGNET PROGRAM

The Engineering Magnet Program is a dynamic, innovative interdepartmental program dedicated to preparing our students to embark on and succeed in the fields of engineering and the physical sciences at the undergraduate level. An inimitable aspect of this program is the first-rate, 21st century, state-of-the-art engineering laboratory that supplements the instructional process. Students have access to guest speakers from the field, individualized mentorships, and internships with formalized opportunities established between Fairmont Prep and The Boeing Company. The Class of 2011 graduated 10 Engineering Magnet students, representing an increase from 4 students in 2010.

HYBRID LEARNING

Fairmont Prep is proud to be an early adopter of innovations in Education Technology. Our summer program, which is encouraged for advancement and enrichment in addition to remediation, runs in a hybrid learning format and blends the traditional classroom with interactive online learning. Academic rigor and student outcomes are key components of our hybrid program, causing the Innosight Institute to highlight Fairmont Prep in a recent white paper on blended learning in the United States.

SERVICE LEARNING & TRAVEL

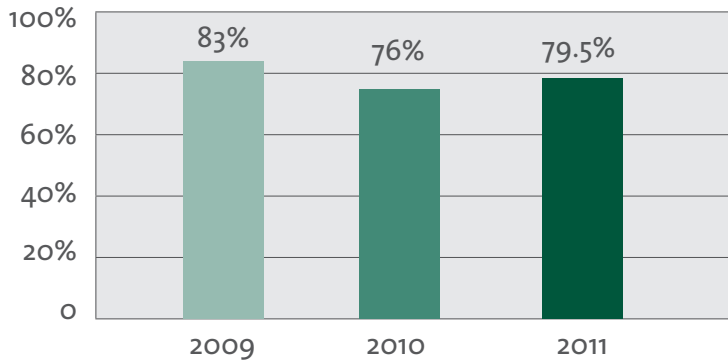

CIF STUDENT ATHLETICS

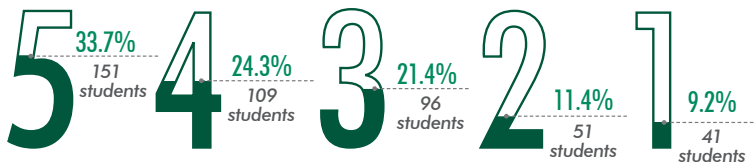

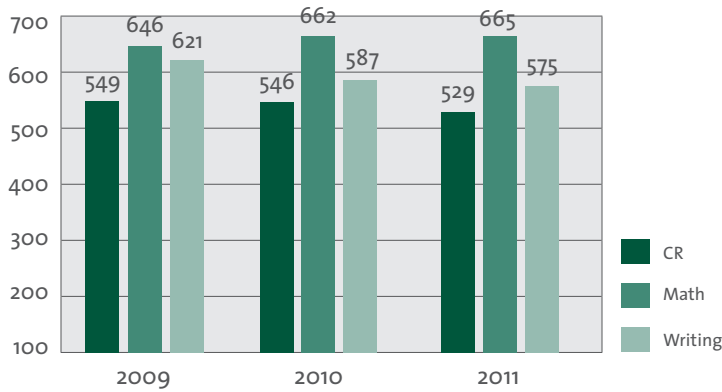
AP PASS RATE



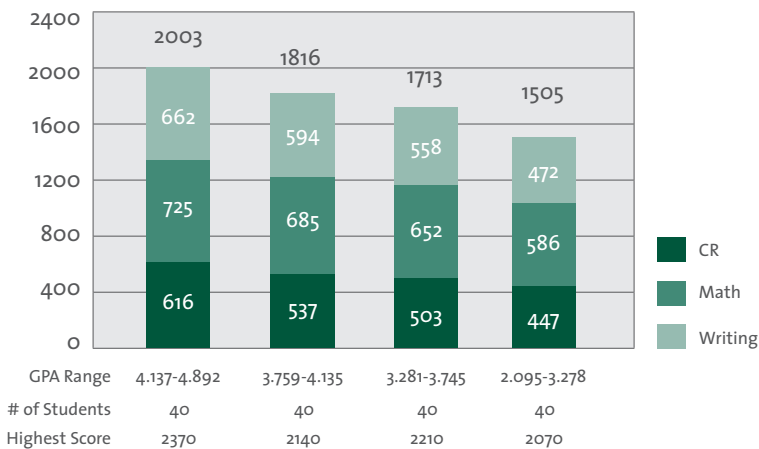
AP DATA BREAKDOWN BY YEAR AND SCORE



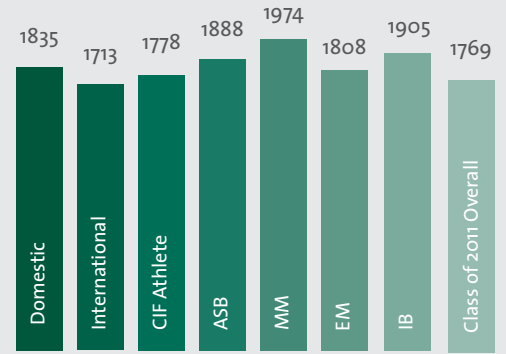
FAIRMONT PREP SAT SCORES

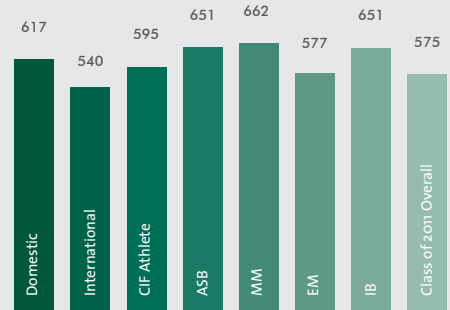

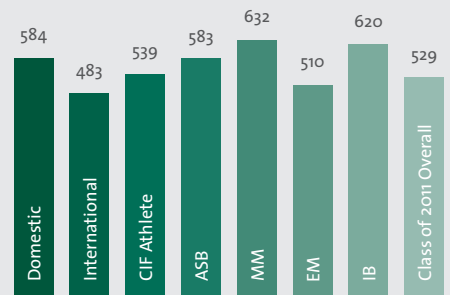
EM - Engineering Magnet

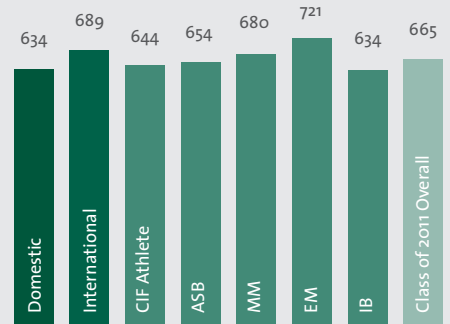
SAT WRITING AVERAGES
